Personal Development

The Edge is a four-year program that gives you the practical, intellectual and moral foundation to be a man of character. Through a combination of seminars, one-on-one mentoring, interactive sessions, and career presentations by successful professionals, it helps you develop the skills and attitudes necessary to be effective in college and later on as a father, a professional, and a citizen.

The Edge is also an opportunity for personal development through the interaction with teachers, staff, and other motivated students who seek to make the most of their lives. From these dealings will come quality friendships that many times extend well beyond the high school years.

Mentoring

Each student is assigned a mentor who will meet individually with him each month. The mentor will help a student find practical and useful applications of the material presented at the seminars.

BIG DECISIONS

(FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES)

The Edge will challenge you to take responsibility for shaping your own life. Facing this responsibility in high school is the key for success both in college and in the larger commitments that come afterwards.

Structure of the Program

The sessions will consist of:

- A Presentation (see topics below)
- An interactive activity aimed at building critical thinking, communication skills and teamwork.
- Monthly one-on-one mentoring that focuses on setting goals and tracking progress will take place in between sessions, by appointment. Mentoring will take place at Tekesta or other convenient locations.

The Curriculum is organized in a two-year cycle that alternates from year to year between Making the Most of High School (2017-2018) and Big Decisions (2018-2019).
